

Clovelly Country Club is a moderate-length, par-72 course (5,531 yards off the club tees) that rewards precision over power. Winding through sand dunes and dotted with water hazards, accuracy is key if you want to score well.

That said, there are some unforgettable drives where a stream hugs the left and a pond guards the green.

- Discover the Peninsula


Hermanus: The Whale Watching Capital


Must-Try Local Delicacies and Drinks

Biltong: Considered South Africa's most loved roadside snack. It is similar to beef jerky but is typically thicker and chewier, made of quality, cured meat hung to dry. You can often buy it from butcher shops where they let you choose the size, texture, and seasoning.

Ostrich Steak: If you visit Oudtshoorn (the ostrich farming capital), you can enjoy dinner at an ostrich farm, specializing in local specialities such as Ostrich Steak.

Amarula: This is South Africa's favorite alcoholic after-dinner cocktail, often compared to Baileys and best served with cream.

Grapetizer and Appletizer: These were two favourite drinks described as a perfect mix of juice and soda, making them a great option to take along on game drives.



A Quick Tip on Tipping

As a practical note for dining out or refuelling: tipping is customary and widely practised. Waiters generally expect a 10% tip for average service, increasing to 15% for a job well done.

Chasing the Sunshine and Green Fairways

The southern part of South Africa boasts diverse climates, meaning there's almost always a fantastic golf destination to explore. However, to truly maximise your experience, we recommend targeting the following windows:

Autumn (March - May): The Golden Season

This is arguably the sweet spot for a golf holiday across much of South Africa. The scorching summer heat has mellowed, and the lush greenery is still vibrant from the summer rains.

Expect temperatures around the 20s °C perfect for 18 holes, less humidity, and generally clear skies. Ideal for combining golf with city exploration in Cape Town, wine tasting in the Cape Winelands, or even a safari.

Spring (September - November): Blooming Beauty

As winter loosens its grip, South Africa awakens with a flourish. This is another excellent time, particularly for those looking to explore the Garden Route.





Temperatures are pleasantly warm, and the landscape is alive, perfect for tackling the iconic courses of Fancourt and Pezula along the Garden Route.

Things to Bear in Mind When Travelling to South Africa

While South Africa offers fantastic infrastructure, planning requires forethought. Golf holiday packages are the best way to combine golf with bucket-list activities like safaris and wine tasting. Plan for a minimum of 10 to 14 days to allow yourself enough time to play golf with a safari and/or wine experience.


