

Best Time to Visit Thailand

The period between November and April offers the least rainfall and humidity, resulting in clear, sunny days, light breezes, and great golfing conditions. This is the cool season, which runs from November to February/March.

Traveling during the "Green Season" (May to October) means more humidity and potential rainfall, but the courses are relatively quiet, making it easier to secure





desired tee times and often offering discounted green fees. Shoulder seasons like October, March, and November/April offer great value.

Escaping the Cold

Thailand is a prime destination for a warm winter sun escape, allowing golfers to enjoy sunshine and pleasant breezes while escaping cold weather at home.


North and Central Thailand

With temperatures mainly in the 20s°C especially in the mornings and evenings the North and Central part of Thailand are ideal for golf and sightseeing.

Southern Thailand

Temperatures in the South are slightly warmer, often around the 28°C - 33°C especially around the coasts.

The Andaman Coast (e.g. Phuket and Krabi) sees consistent clear weather, whilst The Gulf Coast (e.g. Koh Samui) will have some rainfall in November but will be dry in February.

Golf in Thailand: From Green Fees to Your Own Caddie

Thailand is home to over 200 golf courses. Some of the most famous golf destinations in the country are **Bangkok**, **Pattay**, **Hua Hin, Chiang Mai** and **Phuket**.

Courses are world-class, often set in lush tropical fairways and picturesque areas.

Many have been designed by legendary architects such as Jack Nicklaus, Greg

Norman, Nick Faldo, Pete Dye, and Robert

Trent Jones. With constant maintenance they are kept in immaculate condition.





With so many courses, Thailand is suitable for golfers of any handicap and play level.

Your Own Personal Caddie

An integral and unique part of the Thai golf experience is the optional caddie at many courses. Caddies (usually female) provide exceptional value-added service, greeting you upon arrival, guiding you around the course, giving distances, marking balls, offering tips on the layout and green slopes, and keeping you cool and refreshed.

Green fees are offered at reasonable rates, making golf much cheaper than in most other destinations in Asia. Pattaya is noted as one of the cheapest golf holiday destinations, offering the most choice with 21 courses within a 45-minute drive.

Some of Our Favourite Golf Courses in Thailand

Bangkok

Alpine Golf & Sports Club - Consistently ranked among the top 3 courses in Thailand. Hosted the Johnnie Walker Classic, where Tiger Woods won in 2000 and 2004. Requires both power and finesse on its elevated, flawlessly maintained championship layout.

Thai Country Club - Hailed as one of Asia's premier golf courses. Hosted major tournaments, including the 1997 Asian Honda Classic won by Tiger Woods.

Pattay

Siam country Club - One of the top facilities in Thailand. Hosts the Thailand Open and the Honda LPGA Thai Tournament. Features an exquisite design, striking bunkers, and sloping greens, with some holes reminiscent of Augusta's Amen Corner.

Hua Hin

Black Mountain Golf Club - Often rated among the top 100 golf courses worldwide and noted as a top course in Thailand. It hosts prestigious European and Asian Tour events. Known for breathtaking holes and outstanding service, as well as wildlife strolling the fairways.

Pineapple Valley Golf Club - Recognized as "The Best Golf Club Experience in Asia Pacific". Highly playable layout suitable for golfers of diverse abilities, including high handicappers.

Phuket

Red Mountain Golf Club - Skillfully integrated into rugged rock terrain.

Captivating course known for dramatic scenery, elevation changes, lakes, and canyons.

Blue Canyon Country Club - One of Asia's most esteemed championship courses. Hosted the Johnnie Walker Classic three times and known for Tiger Woods' 1998 Asian victory.

After a challenging round on one of Bangkok's championship courses, there's no better way to unwind and immerse yourself in Thai culture than by embarking on a culinary journey through its floating markets. It's an adventure for the senses, a feast for the palate, and a truly unforgettable aspect of any golf trip to this incredible city.

While several floating markets dot the city's periphery, each offers a unique flavor. **Damnoen Saduak**, perhaps the most iconic, is a kaleidoscope of activity. Here, boat after boat laden with fresh produce, vibrant flowers, and an astonishing array of prepared dishes jostle for space. You can literally reach out and pluck a steaming bowl of boat noodles (kuay tiew rua) from a vendor's craft, the



rich, dark broth a perfect counterpoint to the verdant landscape. Don't miss the opportunity to try freshly grilled seafood, succulent satay, or the ubiquitous mango sticky rice, a sweet, creamy indulgence that's practically a national treasure. Other markets in the city include: Amphawa, Talling chan, Khlong Lat Mayom, Bang Nam and Tha Kha Floating Market.



Bangkok: The Pulsating Heart

For a taste of local life, a longtail boat trip along the Chao Phraya River and its klongs (canals) offers a unique perspective of the city.

Thailand's largest island, Phuket, combines stunning beaches with a plethora of activities both on land and at sea. On land, visit the towering Big Buddha for panoramic island views, or explore the charming Sino-Portuguese architecture of Phuket Old Town. Ethical elephant sanctuaries provide a heartwarming opportunity to observe these magnificent creatures in a respectful environment.

Hua Hin: Royal Retreat & Coastal Charms

Once a quiet fishing village and now a favorite royal escape, Hua Hin offers a more relaxed pace with a touch of elegance. The exquisite Maruekhathaiyawan Palace, a beautifully preserved teakwood summer palace, provides a fascinating glimpse into Thai royalty.
